J. Intergroup Liaison (Tina Y) - Central office: an unidentified car crashed into a corner of the building; no one was hurt or identified. The only damage was to some of the archives room furnishings, with no other important items being damaged. Grapevine has been inconsistent lately due to an issue at the post office. Eileen suggests calling prior to stopping by, to make sure the current issue is available. The central office currently has several pieces of literature available for free or \$1. Please call the central office for further details. The board of directors says January finished with positive revenue due to higher contributions, \$2,503 from floating Big Book breakfast and \$5,000 from the State line retreat. The 12-step call list has been revamped and updated. The first of its kind, hybrid and in person workshop is being organized to be held at the central office and zoom on June 28th, 1pm to 3pm. The topic is "our shared Journey: Voices on Unity and Overcoming challenges." The board of directors approved a revision to the accounting structure, adding a Special events contributions column to distinguish from group contributions. This had no effect on the 2025 totals. Silver Streak has reached 1020 subscribers. If you previously subscribed but are not receiving your copy, please resubscribe. Old business: A member stated that by the Board of Directors not bringing the budget to the intergroup prior to approving it was, in effect, breaking traditions. The board did review this and found nothing in the bylaws that would require approval from the intergroup; the bylaws can be viewed at the central office at any time. It was suggested that they put in a request to have the bylaws be changed to reflect their concern. New business: It was brought to our attention that the board did not bring the new committee members to the intergroup for a vote prior to establishing their position as stated in the bylaws, A motion was made to immediately have those positions vacated to allow for a proper vote. The Board acknowledged they did make a mistake, and took full responsibility, stating that moving forward all bylaws will be followed. The motion did not pass.
