Some members quietly navigate low vision, hearing loss, dyslexia, mobility limitation, neurodivergent, anxiety, language differences, or other challenges. Many never ask for special attention, they simply try to participate the best they can. That's why the SAGSC Accessibilities Committee is hosting a hybrid workshop "Our Shared Journey: Voices on Unity and Recovery". We'll hear directly from sober alcoholics who navigate our Fellowship with visual impairments, dyslexia, and neurodivergence. They'll share what it's really like to walk into a meeting, read our literature, follow a speaker, or take on service commitments when the world—and sometimes our rooms—aren't built with them in mind. We'll also hear from guest sponsors who will talk about walking the Three Legacies with sponsee's who face access barriers— Marita R. and Greg M. The workshop will be held **Sunday, June 28th, from 1:00 to 3:00 PM Pacific Time**, both in person at the Las Vegas Central Office and online via Zoom, so people can participate in the way that works best for them. Second item for discussion brought forward by Randy: If a group is in need of a service position, take the D1 open position back to your group and have someone become a liaison for the D1 open positions.

Danielle T. brought up the fact that we sit on a lot of money, what are we doing with the money that is being sent to us from groups? How are we helping the suffering alcoholic and getting the message out? Responses: Randy - all three budgets in conferences have had to reduce their services and budgets due to lack of funds. Mike - I can appreciate what was said, I don't agree that \$5,000 is a lot of money. We need it for the trip to the San Diego conference. DaNella - if we chose to use the money, consider helping GSRs get to assemblies and the Alt. DCM go to assemblies, conferences, PRAASA. Ralph - against 7th Tradition to store funds with nothing in mind. Groups aren't making responsible contributions, they are using a pie chart that was suggested years ago. His home group discusses where the money is going to do the most AA good. Greg - How many have been on a face to face 12 step call in the last month (show of hands) , two people went on a 12 step call. When was the last time we went over to UNLV to speak to professionals, physician? We need to focus on 12 step work. We are below 30% in 12 step work.
